MICHIGAN CONFERENCE – UNITED IN LOVE

What would it feel like if you had MEDICAL DEBT of over 5% or more of your income? What would it feel like if that medical debt were suddenly FORGIVEN?

Right now, there are hundreds of Michigan families who are burdened with medical debt. They could be someone you know: an aunt, a brother, or a friend.

Bethel United Church of Christ, in conjunction with the Michigan Conference UCC Prophetic Integrity Mission Area Team, has partnered with the organization RIP Medical Debt (RIP MD) to begin a campaign, "Michigan UCC – United in Love" that will FORGIVE ALL the medical debt for hundreds of families in Michigan.

When you MAKE A CONTRIBUTION through **RIP Medical Debt** your donation helps eliminate medical debt for these struggling families. RIP Medical Debt then works with these families to help them reestablish their credit.

WHAT?

YES! RIP MD acquires medical debt from secondary collection sources like collection agencies and, through the generosity of donors, TOTALLY ELIMINATES that debt at a 100:1 ratio. That means for every dollar we raise, \$100 in medical debt is eliminated.

Right now, the total debt RIP MD has acquired for Michigan families is \$4 million dollars. But, because RIP MD can eliminate that debt for pennies on the dollar, it will take \$40,000 to REDUCE the WHOLE debt.

That is our goal!

We are asking you, as a colleague in Christ in our Michigan Conference, to help us ERASE this debt for our neighbors in Michigan. So together, UNITED IN LOVE, we will relieve the crushing burden placed on already sick Michiganders who cannot afford the medical cost of their illness.

Report from Trustees - August 2022 Newsletter

For the month of June, our tithes and offerings of \$9,049 exceeded our budget by \$1,132 or 14%. For the first six months (January-June) of the year, routine giving is on par with budget. We appreciate the generosity of our church family.

A plan is underway to replace audio cabling in the sanctuary which has failed after many years. New cabling will improve audio reliability for both in-house and streaming needs. This enhancement also presents an opportunity to relocate the church sound mixer currently in the narthex to be closer to the live stream operator. We have submitted a grant request to the Michigan Conference for funding that will cover associated costs.

Trustees are beginning to draft a 2023 operating budget to be presented in advance of the church's Annual Meeting. We have also appointed a work group to begin planning for our annual Stewardship Campaign beginning in early fall.

Thank you for the many ways in which you contribute time, talent, and treasures for the continued well-being of our vibrant church community.

Parish and Pastor Relations

Our church's Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) is a standing committee whose purpose is to support a healthy relationship between our pastor and church participants, thus enhancing the effectiveness of our church's ministry. - 2) As a support group for the pastor's leadership: interpreting roles, functions, boundaries, opportunities, and needs of the pastor to our congregation.

If, however, you would prefer to speak to a member of the Pastoral Relations Committee, we invite you to do so.
