Pastor's Column –December 2021

"New Book and Clothing Cabinet Underway!"

Several months ago, Mardee Storing asked me about the church having a cabinet outside so that people could receive free winter clothing for children. We talked about putting it in the gazebo, or along side Otsego Avenue side of fellowship hall. Both of those ideas wouldn't work so well, given the amount of snow we get in Gaylord. So, I took the idea to the Reaching Out team and to the Trustees. Yes, we wanted their support and approval, but even more so, we needed to refine the idea and find the best place to put it. Eventually, we knew we would need Council approval, but first things first.

Thanks to the Reaching Out team and Trustees we came up with a great location for the new box. It will be along the parking lot side of the fellowship hall. In the meantime, Roger Brummel suggested that maybe he and Chuck Falk could build it! The church was also approached about having a children's lending library on church grounds that would be maintained by the Guardian Gals. Roger and Chuck thought we could put both things in the same cabinet. They went to work on the design and have already started the work (see the picture! That is the base for the cabinet). Also, we want to thank those who donated the lumber to build the new cabinet.

Mardee gave me clothing to put in the new cabinet before she passed away. The idea is that we would have warm clothing (hats, gloves, socks, whatever could be donated) in the cabinet and people could come and take the items whenever they needed them. No signing in. No having to come when the church was open. Whenever you need something, if it's there, you can take it. Reaching Out team has accepted the responsibility for managing the clothing half of the cabinet.

The lending library would be a take a book, leave a book center and Guardian Gals will make sure there are books there to be loaned out. They will completely manage their side of the cabinet.

We then took the idea to Council who supported the project unanimously.

The only concern we have now is that people may leave items that are not appropriate for either side of the cabinet, so we are saying "no donations" on the cabinet itself. Church members are invited to donate items to the clothing side of the cabinet through the church office or a member of Reaching Out. We just don't have a lot of storage room and want to make sure the items donated are usable and fit the mission of the cabinet.

Soon, we will dedicate the completed cabinet in memory of Mardee Storing. She was very thankful when she heard that this was going to happen. Amid her other life struggles at the time, it was a joy to see the smile on her face that we could make this happen to serve the Gaylord community.

There are conversations about how we might use the cabinet to help people in the summertime. If you have thoughts or suggestions of what we might do with the cabinet in the summer, please see a member of the Reaching Out team, or me.

What a great way for us to serve people in need in our community! Thank you to everyone who made this happen!


INSTALLATION SERVICE

- We are grateful for your continued contributions to the work of our church. For those attending Sunday worship in person, collection plates are always available in the Narthex, or you can mail your gifts to the church office (218 W. Second St.). - Current year offerings through October, 2021 totaled \$77,143 compared to a budgeted amount of \$76,900 for the same period. Rest assured that gifts of any amount truly make a difference. Thank you for your ongoing generosity.
- Dedication of 2022 Stewardship pledges took place during our worship of November 7th. Thus far we have received 32 pledges for a total of \$67,460, reflecting 71% of the amount budgeted for 2022. Pledges are a reflection of <u>intended</u> giving, allowing Trustees to plan responsibly; however, we fully understand if life circumstances result in the need for change at a later date.
