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Texts: Isaiah 40: 9-11; Luke 1: 67-~~68~~ 79

Just who are the prophets and what is their role in our faith story? Are they predictors of the future? Is their only function to tell us Jesus is coming? Are they just popular preachers? How did their work get into the Bible, anyway? These, and other questions are common when it comes to the prophets. Most people think them prognosticators, whose only role was to tell us the Messiah, whom we say is Jesus, was coming as appointed by God. Now that is not entirely wrong, as clearly there are many scriptures, particularly from the prophet Isaiah that seem to speak of his coming. The most prominent one, Isaiah 9: 2-7, we will hear next Sunday. But is that their only role?

I would argue that in fact this was a secondary role, only known in hindsight. Their primary role was centered in their present circumstances. Hear again the scripture from the book of Isaiah this morning:
