## Pastor's Column – February 2024 "Hard to Believe"

Remember back in December when it was so warm, and we had no snow (or little) for Christmas? People wondered if we'd ever have winter at all. I'm sure some businesses in our area that rely on snow and winter activities were concerned for their bottom line. Others may have been glad at the prospect of no snow for winter, and warmer temperatures. Nevertheless, it was hard to imagine that winter would come, even though we knew in the back of our mind that Gaylord and Northern Michigan rarely go snow and cold free.

Faith is the same way. As the book of Hebrews relates, faith is a thing unseen. Faith is believing something that is hard to prove by looking out the window and taking a temperature. To look around our world, it wouldn't be hard to imagine people struggling with faith. Is God really active? Will the visions of Revelation (the final joy of reconciliation) actually happen? Do we, as people of faith, actually have a conviction about things unseen?



It's a hard question for some among us to answer. Maybe it's tough for all of us from time to time. It is okay to ask questions and to wonder sometime what will happen as we look around and see signs that what we believe to be true doesn't have a lot of a lot of evidence to support it right now. War is rampant. People are hurting everywhere. Society seems to be falling apart. We're just not sure.

Meanwhile, our Bible and the story of the life of Jesus remind us that amid the worst that the world has to dish out, God surprises us in ways we could never imagine. Whether it's the people of Moses finding their freedom, or the resurrection of Jesus, or a host of other "unbelievable" surprises, God is never finished. Love does win. And just like winters in Northern Michigan, God's activity may surprise us. But that doesn't mean that God is unreliable, or inactive, or that our faith is misplaced.

Yes, it is sometimes hard to believe. But our faith is real. May you find the hope that comes from knowing God is active, even when it's hard to see and hard to believe.
