Pastor's Column "Moving Forward with a Plan"

By now, you all have heard of the survey we are conducting as part of our strategic planning process in partnership with Convergence. As of this writing, twenty-four have completed the survey, and I hope that by the time you receive this, that number will be higher. It is step one in a process that I hope will give us a "true north" or a direction to follow over the next several years.

In addition to our work with Convergence, I have gotten back to reading books on church growth,

development, planning and other such matters. The latest one was recommended to me by a participant here, and one of the authors was president of the seminary I attended in Kansas City. The book is Sustaining While Disrupting: The Challenge of Congregational Innovation (F. Douglas Powe, Jr and Lovett H. Weems, Jr authors).

The book had many useful tools, but the one I found most helpful was the "so that" formula. The authors write, "These two simple words can transform well-intentioned hard work into actual results that advance the mission. Here is how to use the phrase:

We will do X so that Y occurs.

I invite you to try it for yourself related to ministries, programs and even worship in our church. It is harder than you think. Try these: We have a choir so that...; We have a greeter so that... Why do we do what we do? What is the outcome we expect? Then we can ask ourselves if the ministry is accomplishing the goal we hope it will. If not, we either discontinue, or we change it so that it does.


The only reason to do this is so that our energies are used toward a shared goal. The authors remind us, "We can easily become preoccupied with *what* we are doing that we lose sight of *why* we are doing it."

This is not an evaluation of whether a program is good or bad, but whether it is the best use of our energy and resources.

I wonder what impact one phrase would have on what we do and why we do it?
