Pastor's Column - July 2022

"Play Time!"

I know that for some of you, our sermon series based on the theme of "play" is a little uncomfortable. I appreciate your willingness to engage and allow yourself to be challenged as to why play, in the context of church, is uncomfortable. In fact, I encourage all of us to investigate those things that make us uncomfortable. Often it is in discomfort that we learn the most.

Having said that, I want to share with you a couple of stories from a book I've been reading. It is by Anne Hillman and it is called *Awakening the Energies of Love: Discovering Fire for the Second Time, Second Edition*. Hillman has a section on play near the middle of the book. They are cute stories, but have a powerful point to make. They are found in her chapter, *Interlude*, found on pages 188 and 189 of the book.

A week ago, we made a new swing and hung it from a high branch on a Monterey pine. I love to swing out over the field! The first time I sat on its maple seat and pushed off into the air, a movement near a split-rail fence to the north caught my eye. I had startled two young fawns grazing at the edge of the meadow, and they had scattered fast. But their curiosity got the better of them. They seemed enchanted by what they saw — a human being swinging in the air! They started to come closer, got partway, and stopped. Not quite daring to come further, they stood stock-still and watched.

The day before, one of the fawns had tried to get a jack-rabbit to play. She sneaked up on the baby rabbit as it nibbled the spring grass and jumped in place as if to scare it.

The rabbit turned and ran a little way and the fawn gave chase, then stopped and waited for the rabbit to return. Sure enough, the rabbit came back, sidled as close as it dared, and waited for the fawn to take up the pursuit again. They kept it up for several minutes until the doe got tired of the ruckus and chased her fawn into submission.

Another day, we watched a similar game between a puppy and a calf. When they encountered one another unexpectedly, they sniffed around a bit, tested each other with the same startle behavior, then pretended to menace one another, jostling and chasing for half an hour. It seemed strange to see the comparatively huge calf romping with a puppy, but they were allured to relationship.

We arise out of relationship.

It is the ground of who we are.

It's all about relationship. And everyone needs them. Play is one way we get to know one another. In every one of these stories, the creatures were not the same, and in fact, we couldn't imagine them being together. And yet, through play, relationship was born between them – even if for a moment.

What could play do for us that would help us recognize differences, but find ways to be in relationship?

Report from Trustees – July 2022 Newsletter

- For the month of May, our income was substantially more than budgeted, thanks to a generous memorial contribution recorded from Mardee Storing's estate. Because this contribution was made with express wishes that it be used for future facility needs, we will earmark the gift accordingly. Without this special one-time memorial contribution, our income was roughly on par with budget, and we appreciate the generosity of our church family.
- Trustees are attempting to address some technical infrastructure issues that are interfering with normal livestreaming of our church services. Interim solutions have been identified for the short term; longer term, we've identified a need to replace microphone audio cables that have failed after many years of service. A subgroup has been identified to work toward the longer term solution.
