TORNADO RESPONSE

First, let us be grateful that as far as we know all our participants are safe and had little or no damage from the tornado. The church also sustained no damage, except the power outage spoiled some food that was in the refrigerator, but a minor amount (about \$150, covered by donors).

Second, let us also be grateful that there were not more injuries and deaths than there were that day. While losing any life is tragic, it could have been far worse.

Third, I was pleased to hear from our Michigan Conference of the United Church of Christ as they offered to help in any way they can. Also, churches in Newaygo, Hudsonville and Atlanta have contacted either us or the conference to lend their aid. The national United Church of Christ has been in touch as well. Sometimes we forget that we are part of a larger family which is the United Church of Christ. They seem so far away, and yet, in times of need, here they are.

Having said that...we all know that the needs are great and our community is stepping forward in dramatic ways. The Community Foundation and United Way are taking the lead on the response. See below the volunteer and donor opportunities through those two organizations. You may give and/or volunteer directly through them.

We will also be doing our part as a congregation to help. Community Meals will continue (with the exception of Friday, May 27 and the July 4 holiday weekend) through the summer. We are short of volunteer groups to help with this. Maybe you or someone you know could help out on a Friday night? On Saturday, May 28 we are going to gather at 12 noon here at church to construct sandwiches that will be delivered by volunteers who will be working hard to help our community recover. If you will help construct sandwiches and help serve them, we would love your help. Just show up at noon and we'll go from there. If you want to help cover the cost, feel free to write a check to Community Meal.

In addition to the things we do, we also need to process what has occurred. Even if we had no damage, or a little, this affected us all. More than that, we will be needed especially when the media leaves, and the acute crisis has passed, to help people recover and be restored. Hello Loving Community:

Erin Mann here, I wanted to take a moment to give you an update on where we are with our response and coordinated efforts. Please know the Otsego County United Way board members, staff, and volunteers are extending so much empathy and well wishes to tornado victims and the community at large.

Most importantly, if you know of anyone that needs supportive services or direction on how to navigate this tumultuous disaster, please have them call <u>211</u>.

- THANK YOU! In the past three days we have provided 179 services to individuals impacted by the tornado. This includes direct victims, those who lost power, and fuel support for ALICE (asset limited, income constrained, employed) individuals so they can operate their equipment for debris removal.
- THANK YOU! Hundreds and hundreds of people have donated goods and gift cards. Anyone impacted by the tornado can come to collect items, 9 am to 5 pm, Tuesday through Friday this week at the United Way building. Victims can shop multiply times as needs change.

We have thousands of tangible donations. Our "big room" is overflowing. As well as the tractor trailer parked on site donated by Road Warrior Truck Driving school. You are all so amazing. Considering the overwhelming goods, we are asking for gift card donations to local businesses. Gift cards offer victims autonomy in choices and control in a time where so many things in their life are uncertain. Socials are updated often on materials needed as this moving target shifts.

THANK YOU! Two hundred and fifty-one people have interacted with us as a NEW volunteers. This does not include our 350 prior volunteers, those that quietly have showed up and just started pitching in, and all of those with boots on the ground doing clean up. We are asking individuals to fill out a <u>volunteer application</u> to gain access to opportunities.

THANK YOU! You have raised over \$50 thousand dollars in donations. The online campaign does not include onsite donations.

THANK YOU! Plus, \$20,000 dollars from the DTE Foundation and \$25,000 from the Consumers Energy Foundation. OMI 49735

Just so you know, there aren't many groups volunteering to make a meal until fall, so if you and your friends want to put together a meal, please contact Vicky if you will help. Truth is, I've helped at a couple meals and it's a lot of fun while also helping people in need. In case you didn't know, Community Meal also received a grant of \$3000 from 100 Women Who Care here in Gaylord.

There is always more to be done, but many hands make light work. We have a lot of fun working together, and we get much needed items completed.

- We're grateful for everyone who turned out to make our church's Spring Cleanup Day on May 15th a big success! Our little piece of the Gaylord's earth at the corner of Second and US-27 South is looking well cared for as a result of our collective efforts. Thank you!
- Through the month of April, our income from tithes and offerings totaled \$31,152 compared to a budget of \$31,667, approximately \$500 (2%) below budget for the first four months of the year. We appreciate the generosity of our church family.
- After several months of persistent effort, we have the ability to generate routine reports from QuickBooks to monitor church financials in detail. Many thanks to Jessica who worked diligently with our accountant to overcome transition issues.
- A summary of April's Income / Expense report is included, below. Expenses exceeded income
 in April primarily due to timing of a ministry expense. This occurs when designated special collections (such as Our Church's Wider Mission or OCWM) are received over several months, then
 paid to the designated recipient in a single month.
- Thank you for the many ways in which you contribute time, talent, and treasures for the continued well-being of our vibrant church community.
