Pastor's Column—May 2022

"Reduce, Reuse, Recycle"

Gas prices. Everyone is talking about gas prices. It's true, they are remarkably high and not likely to go down anytime soon. It's tough for people to pay these higher prices. It's also true that oil, gas, and other fossil fuels are the commodities most vulnerable to price fluctuations. We simply cannot control the price of fuel. However, we can have some control over how much we use. We can combine trips, carpool, walk or bike (if we are able), and adjust our heating and cooling temperatures. Not only can we save some money, but we can save our planet at the same time. And it needs saving.

The earth itself is in peril. Humanity is responsible for the problems around us.

Whether you agree with me or not, I'm sure you'd like to save some money. That's a good reason to save fuel.

At the same time, I'm sure that most all of us agree that the trees of Northern Michigan make where we live one of the most beautiful places in the world. Trees are renewable but we are using up our forests much faster than they grow. Trees clean our air and our water. Trees are important for our topsoil. Trees planted safely around our homes can assist in our heating and cooling costs. In short, we would do well to save our trees. How can we do that?

We can use less paper products, or we can choose a recycled paper alternative. We can use dishes and wash them, which takes far less water than paper production, or even paper recycling. We can save trees and save water at the same time.

I could go on with many examples of how we can take better care of our earth. In Genesis 1, God gives us "dominion" over the earth. In the original text, the word is better translated "responsibility" than dominion. It's up to us, in large part, to take care of this planet that God has gifted to us. How we do it is as different as each one of us, butt that we do it is critical to our own survival, let alone the survival of animal and plant life.

Whatever your choices, I invite you to take the earth into consideration. Are there changes you and I can make, or that we can make as a church, which will better care for our "corner" of this beautiful world of ours? We could use fewer bulletins on a Sunday as we have the screens with information we need. We could share a bulletin with someone, rather than each of us getting one. We could use our beautiful dishes and silverware, rather than throw away items? Could some meetings be scheduled for when we're already here, saving people a trip? Even our zoom meetings, which I know are not always the best idea, can save energy as we save a trip.

These are just ideas of ways we might make a difference for the good of us all.

What is ours to do to better care for our planet? Earth Day is not just a day in April, it really is every day.
